Welcome to Casa Teja, our little paradise in the middle of the nature next to Tamarindo.

We love saying:

«We live in the jungle and are only 12 minutes away from the jungle».

Yes, Casa Teja is perched on top of a hill, with stunning views on the sea and forest, an environment so quiet you will hear the breeze, birds chirping, howler monkeys and much more. At the same tune, you are a mere 15 minutes away from the human jungle of Tamarindo.

There are only 5 or 6 houses in a radius of 1 km, ensuring a relaxing environment - you can hear the most tenuous sounds and appreciate the surrounding untamed nature. One of the most beautiful beaches, Playa Avellanas, with its laid back and trendy lunch place Lola's, is only 12 minutes away (direct access through Cebadilla). You can enjoy nice treks to walk in the morning when nature is at its best. You will find shopping, post office, doctors and almost anything you need in Villareal, about 8 km away, and in Tamarindo.

Liberia international airport is less than an hour away from the house (via Santa Cruz), with many international flights - direct flights to major US hubs (New York, Atlanta, Houston, Miami, etc.) and Amsterdam & Zurich. The small Tamarindo airstrip is 10 minutes away, with 3 to 4 flights a day to San José. You will need a car to wander around. There are many activities - cycling, horse riding, quad rides, Tyrolean zip lines, fishing, surfing, massage, yoga - all within 15 minutes from the house, and information is available further in this book.

ELECTRICITY



Similar as in the USA, electricity is 110 Volts with a 60 Hz frequency. Plugs are the same as in the USA. Most European electric appliances that use a converter/charger will work with an adapter.

There may be some brief power outages, more so during the winter or rainy season (June 1 - November 30), but they normally do not last long. Each room is equipped with 2 rechargeable flashlights, which are better left in the plug during the day.

WATER



The property has 2 water tanks on site, ensuring adequate supply of water distributed by electric pumps. Water is treated with filters and a water softener and is good for drinking. You should be aware that water is a scarce commodity, particularly during the summer or dry season, and every guest is encouraged to watch consumption.

In case of power outage, the water system will need to be switched by Rigo, the guard, so that water flows by gravity directly from the main water tank to the house.

SEPTIC TANK - TOILETS



All houses in this area are equipped with a septic tank and you are asked to refrain from throwing toilet paper in the bowl. The is a small blue bin next to the toilet in which the paper should be placed. It will be collected by the housekeeper.

HOUSEKEEPING



Maria-José, the housekeeper attends and cleans the house 6 mornings per week (Monday to Saturday inclusive). She will change linen and towels once a week. Do not hestitate to ask her directly should you prefer a different arrangement. She will also collect your garbage.

LAUNDRY



Should you need to do some laundry please ask Maria-José and she will gladly do it for you. Please do not attempt to use the washer and dryer on your own, as we have had some bad experiences with previous guests, so only Maria-José is allowed to operate the washers and dryers. Should you want your clothes to be ironed, Maria-José will be happy to do it for a fee (payable directly to her).

KITCHEN APPLIANCES



The kitchen is well equipped but do not hesitate to ask Maria-José should you need anything else and she will do her outmost to accommodate you.

SECURITY



The area is secure and there has never been any issue. Nevertheless, please secure Casa Teja and lock the entry door when you are going out. Rigo, our guard, and his assistants, Wolfie and Jack, the gold-colored dogs, are keeping a permanent eye on the property. Rigo lives on the property with his wife Maria-José and their young daughter Zoe.

INTERNET



Internet coverage is adequate although the signal strength may be fluctuating. The best place for the strongest signal is near the device, in the kitchen. The network name is «CASA-TEJA» and the password «PuraVida». If you happen to catch a secured network named «wifi», it is the one of the little house across the street, just ignore this network.

POOL & RANCHO



When renting Casa Teja, you will be alone on the property as nobody else will be occupying Casa Bella Vista or vice versa- we follow a one-only-customer rule. You will be able to enjoy the use of the pool and the rancho (barbecue area). The pool is sanitized with salt and there is therefore very little chlorine in the water. A maintenance team services the pool on a twice-weekly basis, ensuring the quality of the water is adequate. We are asking you to store the lounge chair cushions/mattresses in the rancho ovenight and to avoid leaving the cushions/mattresses in the rain. Please clean the barbecue and pizza oven after use

WILDLIFE



You are in Costa Rica, a country that has a large biodiversity and many species of animals. While in the property, you may to encounter monkeys, iguanas, lizards, buffalo toads, small scorpions, spiders and very unlikely a snake (happened to me only three times in 5 years and they were non-venomous toboba gata). These animals will be afraid of you and will leave as you approach. They will only «defend» themselves should they feel in danger or attacked. We have never experienced any problem nor have any of our guests. There are some basic rules however to follow to avoid problems, such as:

- do not walk barefoot without watching your steps (risk of stepping on a small scorpion),
- keep the doors and window-doors closed while you are away (all windows have mosquito screens and can be left open),
- spray yourself with repellent during the rainy season (June 1 November 30) to avoid mosquito bites,
- should you touch a buffalo toad, wash your bands well afterwards otherwise ou may have a reaction if you put a finger in your mouth, otherwise they ar totally harmless,
- Should you be stung by a scorpion, which is like being bitten by a wasp, crush it well under your shoe and then apply the crushed scorpion paste on the bite it will stop hurting and you will have almost no reaction.

Sorne of the animals you will see may surprise you as they are large - such as grasshoppers, praying mantas or !izards - but the vast majority are harmless.

Also, to ensure your security and peace of mind, the houses, rancho and surroundings are fumigated every 2 months, so you are unlikely to see such animals inside the bouse.

FISHING



Again there are many agencies offering fishing tours. Most of them do not own ships but act as brokers. We would recommend Go Fish, based in Tamarindo. Steve and Liisa Quinn can be joined by phone directly on 2653 0709. The costs will vary depending upon the size of the boat and the time spent (half-day, three quarters day, full day). Expect to pay between \$600 and \$1,200.

SURFING



A number of surf schools are available in Tamarindo. Your choice will depend upon your level, whether you are a beginner or someone with experience.

ZIP LINE - HORSE RIDING - QUAD



Whilst there is a lot of competition in this kind of activity, we have our favorite. Hacienda El Roble is a 4th generation privately-run farm that is offering all these activities. The offering is just astounding with many zip lines, the longest almost 700 meters long. It is one of the rare one featuring a double cable line to provide ultimate safety. For those who are not keen on zip line, it is possible to go for a horse riding or quad tour through the farm estate. The owners speak perfect English and are very friendly. We do strongly recommend them as the estate offers great views. They are located in Coyolito de Belen, a small village on the main road from Huacas to Belen, i.e. some 30 minutes away from the house, and are easy to find as there are signs indicating Hacienda El Roble.

BEACHES



Guanacaste has many of the prettiest beaches of Costa Rica. We are lucky to have many close to our bouse, in particular the following 3 are our favorite.

Playa Avellanas is the closest. A surf paradise mile-long white sand beach, it is a buzz due to Lola's, the perfect lunch place - feet in the sand, view of the beach, and under the shade of beautiful trees. A must experience. It is a 15-minute drive through Cebadilla and Pinilla, and then South.

The longest beach is Playa Grande. A beautiful white sand beach with almost no construction along the beach. You will enjoy great views of Tamarindo as it is North of the estuary, across from Tamarindo. It is accessible by car and you will have to go to Huacas and then follow the signs Playa Grande. This will take you 25 minutes.

Finally, Playa Flamingo is a beautiful beach, smaller than the 2 others but pleasant due to the Coco Loco, a small beach restaurant & bar that serves excellent light lunches. A must visit during your stay. If you like coconut, try the coco loco, a coconut & rum based drink - outstanding. To get to Playa Flamingo, you will need to drive to Huacas and then follow the direction of Playa Flamingo, a 30-minute drive altogether. It will take you through the cute village of Brasilito, on the shore.


itineraries

ITINERARIES

There are two ways to access Casa Teja, one road is in better condition but has more crossings (Itinerary 1) and the second one, (Itinerary 2) which has one turn but can be tougher depending on the time of the year) You can also find Bella Vista on Google maps.

ITINERARY GREEN

- From Santa Cruz, Villareal road, turn into Cañafistula (at restaurant La Finca)
- Follow road into village (direction Cebadilla)
- After 350 meters (30 seconds), turn right (second right after La Finca)
- After 200 meters, turn right at the sawmill
- Follow the road during 2km, leaving the sawmill on your left
- Cross a small river (could be dry) and continue for about 2 km, keeping left at the crossings
- You will pass a house on your right (Casa Paloma), continue and Casa Teja will be right in front of you (red walls)
- Turn left and immediately right to the entrance of Casa Teja



ITINERARY BLUE

- From Santa Cruz, Villareal road, turn into Cañafistula (at restaurant La Finca)
- Follow road into village and continue straight for 1,4km (direction Cebadilla)
- At the top of the hill, before the road starts going down, turn right into small road with cattle grid
- Follow for 1km (going up and then down)
- The first house you will see, Casa Teja will be right in front of you (red walls)
